Many people in ancient Egypt chose to be mummified when they died. They did this because they believed that they had to preserve their bodies to use in the afterlife. It took about 70 days to complete the mummification process.

We know about the Ancient Egyptians because of evidence left behind from that time, such as wall art, ancient Egyptian writing and artefacts. These have been discovered by archaeologists and studied by experts.

The Ancient Egyptians used hieroglyphics to write things down. These are symbols that represent sounds or words.

The Ancient Egyptians used to have many different Gods and Goddesses that they would pray to when they needed to.

Egyptian society had a hierarchy - this means that some groups of people were thought to be more important than others. Each group had a different role to play in Egyptian society.










