

History

This half term the children will understand historical similarities and differences through the study of the Vikings and their way of life. We will discover all about the Vikings, as we learn about the places of origin, the chronology of Viking history, daily life and their fierce raids. The children will be able to think historically and discuss what artefacts can tell us about this time in history.
