- There are seven life processes that all living things do. They are:
 Movement, Respiration,
 Sensitivity, Growth, Reproduce,
 Excretion and Nutrition.

- Humans can change their habitat in order to survive but many other living things cannot.
- Smaller living things, such as insects, live in microhabitats.
