## Vocabulary

<b>Worship</b>	To assign worth or value to something.
<b>Bible</b>	The holy book for Christians.
<b>Font</b>	Something that holds the holy water for baptisms (it is often made from stone).
<b>Altar</b>	A table in a church used for religious ceremonies.
<b>Pews</b>	Seats in a church.
<b>Pulpit</b>	A raised platform in a church where priest or vicar can read from.
<b>Chalice</b>	A large cup which is used in Holy Communion.
<b>Holy Communion</b>	People remember Jesus by having the bread and wine.
