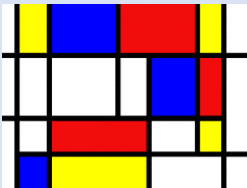

Sticky Knowledge

- Painting is the art of creating pictures using colours, tones, shapes lines and textures.
- There are lots of different colours, each with different shades and tones.
- The 3 primary colours are blue, yellow and red.
- Primary colours are colours that cannot be made by mixing colours together.
- Piet Mondrian was a Dutch artist who painted abstract pictures mainly using the primary colours.
- The secondary colours are green, purple and orange.
- Secondary colours are made by mixing two primary colours.
- Yellow and blue make green.
- Blue and red make purple.
- Red and yellow make orange.
- Tinting is when a colour is mixed with white to make lighter colours.
- We can make darker shades by adding black to a colour.

| Primary Colours | Primary colours are colours that cannot be made by mixing colours together. |
| Secondary Colours | A secondary colour is a colour made by mixing of two primary colours. |
| Colour Wheel | A colour wheel shows you how colours relate to each other cold and warm colours. |
| Warm Colours | One side of the colour wheel that includes red, yellow, and orange. This evokes warmth because they remind us of things like the sun or fire. |
| Cold Colours | The other side of the colour wheel that includes blue, green, and purple. This evokes a cool feeling because they remind us of things like water or grass. |
| Shade | A mixture of pure colours to which only black is added. |
| Tinting | A tint is a colour mixed with white. |
